

Religious Stuff Knowledge and Emotions in Christianity After the Material Turn

Interdisciplinary Workshop with Prof. Katherine Dauge-Roth, Samuel Weber, and Andreas Berger

This workshop explores how a broad range of media—texts, objects, bodies, and communal settings—shaped religious knowledge and emotions in Christianity.

Recent scholarship has shifted from a focus on theological ideas to an understanding of religion as grounded in material and practical engagements with the divine. This perspective has opened new ways of interpreting devotional life, moving beyond familiar oppositions between Protestant textuality and Catholic materiality and showing that all religions and confessions relied on mediated practices to negotiate their relationships with heaven and earth.

Building on these insights, the workshop examines how media ensembles enabled believers to generate, embody, and share religious knowledge and affect.
